Essential Terms

Essential Term #1: Hawaiian Culture

Hawaiian culture is experienced by students through daily wehena (chanting) and values, hō'ike (demonstration of skills learned to an authentic audience), traditional practices (imu and planting styles), and environmental literacy through 'Ike Hawaii curriculum.

Essential Term #2: Postsecondary Readiness

Students communicate effectively (verbal, written, technologies). Career pathway programs in agro-forestry, coastal marine management, agriculture and culinary art. stimulate early interest in and preparation for college and career among preschool and K–12 learners and their families.

Essential Term #3: 'Ohana and Community involvement:

Families play an active role in school life through 'ohana hours/events and community supported educational programs for literacy, health, economic sustainability and others.
