The 2022 Texaco Poster Contest

Grade 6 - 8

For over 20 years, the Annual Texaco Poster Contest has become a State Science Fair tradition. Each Science Fair season, students from grades 6-12 may submit a poster with the selected theme. Students do not need to be science fair participants to enter. A panel of professional judges, with backgrounds in graphic design, textiles, media and/or art come together to select the Top 3 posters from each division (JR Division: grades 6-8). The top winners are awarded cash prizes sponsored by Texaco. The winning poster is featured on the cover of the Hawaii State Science & Engineering Fair program the following year. Instructions for the 2022 Poster Contest will be available soon. This year’s theme is **BIOMEDICAL & HEALTH SCIENCES**. Please submit all application materials and posters by **April 1, 2022**.

Applications are being accepted to help close the gap for at-risk students by providing free mobile Wi-Fi hotspots and internet service.

School districts, charter schools, and community-based non-profit organizations that serve at-risk youths are eligible to apply. Each student awardee will receive the following:

- * Free AT&T LTE mobile wireless internet service for 14 months
- * A free mobile Wi-Fi hotspots for each line of service
- * In-network content filtering

Please note that students to be served must be located within an AT&T LTE mobile coverage area.

The online application portal will close on September 30th.

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Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) Program

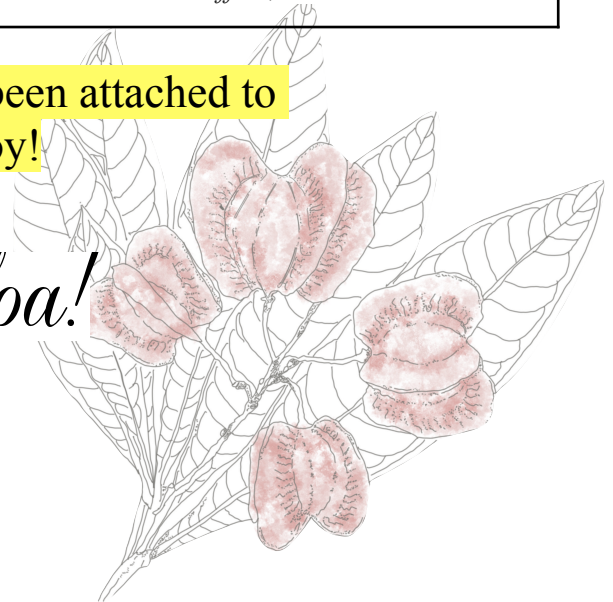
The FCC (Federal Communications Commission) announced that households with a member approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision, in the current 2021-2022 school year are also eligible for the Emergency Broadband Benefit.

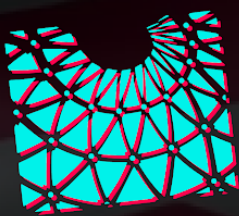
